## WHAT IS WOOD BADGE FOR THE 21<sup>ST</sup> CENTURY?

The Wood Badge experience will consist of two weekends. During the first weekend, participants will be divided into groups that will operate as a patrol throughout the Wood Badge Course. Dining and sleeping arrangements will be provided for you. The second weekend will involve an outdoor experience for participants where the patrols provide for their own shelter, equipment and meals.

## SR-1075 INFORMATION

Wood Badge Course SR-1075 will be conducted at Cape Fear Scout Reservation utilizing both Camp Bowers and Camp McNeil. This course will be conducted over two weekends. Participants should understand that their arrival time will be at 7:00 AM on both Nov 5 and Dec 4. Departure time on Sunday, Nov 7 will be approximately 6:00 PM. Attendance at both weekends for the entire scheduled time is mandatory.

## WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Wood Badge for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century is open to all Scouting positions associated with Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, Varsity Scouts, Venturing, and our Executive Board and district & unit committee members.

## PREREQUISITE TRAINING

To qualify to attend Wood Badge, a participant must have completed the basic training specific to their Scouting position:

### Scouting's Basic Leader Training Courses

- *New Leaders Essentials or "This is Scouting" —All adult leaders*

### Leader Specific Training for:

- *Den Leaders*
- *Cubmasters*
- *Webelos Leaders*
- *Tiger Cub Leaders*
- *Pack Committee Members*
- *Troop Committee Members*
- *Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters*
- *Varsity Scout Coaches and Assistant Coaches*  
*(Previous versions of Leader Training Courses are acceptable prerequisites)*

### Scouting Outdoor Skills Training

- *Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills (required for all Scoutmasters, Assistant Scoutmasters, Varsity Coaches and Assistants)*
- *All participants are encouraged to complete the Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills Training before attending a Wood Badge course, but it is not required.*

## UNIFORMS

The uniform that you would wear in your normal Scouting position will be the uniform that you will wear at Wood Badge. This uniform must include: official BSA shirt, trousers or shorts, web belt, socks and shoulder loops commensurate with your Scouting position.

## PERSONAL EQUIPMENT

A personal equipment checklist will be provided to you shortly after you register. You will be responsible for providing your basic camping gear such as tent, sleeping bag, food and cooking equipment for the outdoor experience on the second weekend.

## FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid may be available to Scouters through their respective units. Wood Badge Training is an invaluable benefit and units should consider the training of their adult leaders as an investment in their future.
