GENERAL GUIDELINES

The Cape Fear Council – Boy Scouts of America is proud to offer this scholarship program in the eight counties served by our council organization. As an organization with a strong sense of community, this scholarship is just one of the ways the Cape Fear Council expresses its commitment to the southeastern North Carolina area. We look forward to the future with a commitment to growth and to the educational endeavors of our local young people.

1. Eligible high school seniors wishing to be considered must complete the appropriate application information forms which are attached. All applicants must be registered Scouts and demonstrate financial need.
2. An official high school transcript of student grades from the beginning of ninth grade to the application deadline must accompany the completed application. The transcript must bear the original signature of the appropriate high school authority.
3. A certified copy of the student's SAT and/or ACT scores must accompany the completed application.
4. Three letters of recommendation must accompany the completed application as follows:
 - a. Signed letter of recommendation from a high school teacher or administrator at the applicant's school.
 - b. Signed letter of recommendation from the registered adult leader of the applicant's Scouting unit.
 - c. Signed letter of recommendation from a community individual NOT related to the applicant.

The writers of all recommendation letters should be capable of reporting on the applicant's participation in the community in terms of work, service, leadership, notable skills, and outstanding recognition.

5. Student Aid Report (SAR) showing the amount of financial aid that applicant qualifies for from college attending must be submitted with application. This information will be used to document financial need of applicant. In case of a close decision, demonstrated financial need will be deciding factor.
6. Copy of acceptance letter from college attending must be submitted with application.
7. Application Deadline is June 2, 2017.
Final Decision and Announcement of Recipient will be July 14, 2017.
Scholarship Funding to be made available to Recipients College or University by August 1, 2017

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MERITS OF ACADEMICS AND LEADERSHIP FOR APPLICANT
(Criteria for Consideration)

The Thomas E. Avent College Scholarship will be awarded to a deserving high school senior. Eligibility requirements include, but are not limited to the following criteria:

1. Current enrollment as a high school senior with a current Grade Point Average of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale.
2. Submission of the application by the designated deadline to the Cape Fear Council. No applications received after deadline will be considered.
3. Scholarship funds to be given toward a two-year community college or four-year college program. Scholarship funds will be awarded for first-year only at an accredited college, university or two-year community college.
4. Personal interview to be conducted if requested by the Avent Scholarship Committee.
