



## Cape Fear Council | Camp McNeill 2019 Fall Cub Scout Family Campout Theme: Patriots Path



**October 11-13, 2019    October 18-20, 2019    October 25-27, 2019**

Get ready for a great time at the Cub Scout Weekends at Camp McNeill. There will be three weekends for Packs to choose from. Registration is first come first served for Packs. There will be a participant limit for all weekends. Each weekend will have the same program and theme. ### **Camping Fees and Registration:**

The cost to attend is \$50.00 per Cub Scout. Adults and siblings are \$30.00 each. A parent or guardian is required to attend with each Scout. T-shirts for the campout are available for pre-order for an additional cost of \$12.00. Pre-ordered t-shirts are available for Packs to pick up at camp during check-in. There will be additional shirts available in the trading post. Your size will not be guaranteed if you do not pre-order shirts. **All registrations and fees are to be submitted prior to coming to the campout.**

### **Camp Refund Policy:**

Camping fees are transferable but not refundable.

### **Check-in:**

Check in at the Camp McNeill Administration Building located next to the parking lot. Check in will be from 4:00 p.m. until 11:00 p.m. on Friday. Late Check in will be available Saturday Morning from 7:30 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. If no one is at the office, please check in at the Trading Post.

For the safety of all guests, vehicle entry to campsites will be strictly controlled. We will have carts available to help you carry gear to your campsites. A Pack trailer will be allowed to be taken to the site. No vehicles will be allowed to park in the site.

### **Campsites:**

Campsites will be assigned based on Pack size and need. Some sites may host more than one Pack. Packs can request a specific site which may have cabins and will be considered on a first come first served basis. Most sites will have a fire ring for Packs to use. If there is not a fire ring in the site, fires are to be built off the ground in a barrel. Packs must use fire barrels or pans to contain campfires.

### **Saturday Flag Ceremony:**

The flag ceremonies will be held at the flag poles in front of the Trading Post. Everyone should attend. Please wear field uniforms (Class A) for evening flags. Information on the activities for that day will be given at this time. Saturday morning flags will be conducted at 7:00am and evening flags will be conducted at 5:45pm.

## **Activities:**

There will be lots of activities during the day. Some activities will center on Adventures or Awards. Scouts are encouraged to attend as many activities as possible. There will be BB shooting, archery, slingshots, and crafts. Scouts will be able to work on their Shooting Sports Award. Scouts who are participating in the Lions program will participate in wild card activities. Advancement activities will include:

Tiger: Curiosity, Intrigue, and Magical Mysteries | Safe and Smart

Wolf: Air of the Wolf | Finding Your Way

Bear: Super Science | Roaring Laughter

Webelos/ AOL: Sports | Aware and Care

A schedule of events will be given at check-in. ALL youth and adults who are camping must complete a **BSA Medical Form Parts A & B**.

## **Bobcat Trail**

On Saturday there will be a station set up for ALL new Cubs to visit that will complete the requirements for the Bobcat Badge. This is the first rank that all Cubs must complete after joining no matter if they are a Tiger, Wolf, Bear, or Webelos/ Arrow of Light. Once completed they will have their name placed on an Advancement Form and that night at the campfire will be recognized.



## **Campfire**

There will be a campfire program on Saturday evening. We will have a Bobcat Ceremony and recognize those new Cub Scouts who participated in the Bobcat Trail that day. Packs will also have the ability to perform skits and songs.

## **Free time**

Free time activities including hiking, fishing, and napping are encouraged. Bring your own rods and bait. Campers may bring their own bikes. Helmets must be worn while riding. Do not ride bike through other campsites and yield to those who are walking. Planned activities will be going on at different times of the day, but these are optional for each Pack.

## **Trading Post**

The camp store will be opened with snacks, souvenirs, and other items for sale.

## **First Aid**

First aid personnel will be on site during the event. Each Pack should have a basic first aid kit in the site for minor first aid needs. For the safety of others, campers who are sick or running a high fever should not attend.

## **Bathrooms/Showers**

There are bathhouses and restrooms around camp for campers to use. Some facilities are female or male only. We must all share in the responsibility to help keep these facilities in good shape. If supplies or maintenance are needed, please let a staff member know.

## **Trash Disposal**

Packs must pack out all trash from the campsite upon leaving camp on Sunday. A trash bin or trailer will be available to dispose of trash bags.

## **Vehicles**

All vehicles are to be parked in the McNeill Admin parking lot. Vehicles are not allowed to park in the campsites. **Riders are NOT allowed in the bed of pickup trucks or on trailers. NO PARKING IN THE CAMPSITES.**

## **Meals**

Saturday breakfast, lunch, dinner and Sunday breakfast will be provided. If there are any dietary needs or restrictions, please let the staff know.

## **Fires at Camp**

If no ban is in place, campfires are allowed in fire rings at their sites. All campfires must be contained within the fire ring or a pan raised off the ground. **Please do not dig holes for campfires.** Campfires must be attended by an adult at all times, including when the Pack attends activities and the campfire ceremony. If the fire is not watched, it must be put out. You may bring firewood or burn downed-wood only. **Do not cut standing trees.** Make sure all fires are completely out before leaving camp.

**Trading Post** will be open during posted hours throughout the day Saturday, and after the campfire. Candy, snacks, drinks, t-shirts, crafts, and other memorabilia is available at the Trading Post. It is for you to use at your own discretion. It is suggested that campers bring \$10-\$50 spending money. Credit and debit cards are accepted.

**Lost and Found:** The lost and found is located in the Camp McNeill Administration Building.

**Vespers:** Non-denominational "Scouts Own" service will be available at Camp McNeill Sunday morning after breakfast.

**Valuables:** Scouts and leaders are encouraged not to bring valuables to camp. Also, please do not let scouts bring unnecessary electronic devices. Let nature and their friends be the entertainment for the weekend!

**No Pets:** Pets are not allowed at Camp McNeill. Nature's creatures are to be left in their natural environment.

**No Fireworks and Firearms:** Fireworks are illegal in North Carolina and are not permitted on camp property. Personal firearms and/or ammunition are not allowed at the Cape Fear Scout Reservation. The use of alcoholic beverages and/or controlled substances at camp is prohibited.
